COACH JEREMY FRASER'S UPDATE

Princeton Sailing launched early this Fall season, with nineteen sailors arriving in the New Jersey area August 27th, a week before the semester started, for a week-long fall training camp with champagne sailing conditions, preparing for the exciting and packed fall regatta schedule.

After a great week of shaking off the rust, the team prepared themselves for a packed fall regatta schedule, sailing fourteen regattas in which they would reach the podium five times, including a win at this year's IOR hosted by Larchmont Yacht Club. The Tiger's successful competitive season cannot be achieved without practice, which we gained this fall. Princeton Sailing saw that fifty-one students made it out on the water this fall to introduce, refresh, or refine their sailing skills! Our most dedicated sailors made it out to practice an average of two to three times a week, being led by a top sailor attending twenty-six practices as we enter the spring season. This fall, we also welcomed the Great Class of 2027 with open arms, taking a week off from practice to give eighty-five Princeton students a chance to join us on the water for an open sailing session. Another fantastic sailing season came to a close at the last regatta-styled practice hosted on November 25th, where we then packed away the boats and looked forward to the spring season and getting back out on the water.

Here in the 2023-24 season, the Tiger Offshore Team rung up its first event win in almost 50 years at the Intercollegiate Offshore Regatta held on Long Island Sound. The team led by Helmsman Jasper Waldman overcame the wild weather and breakdowns to top the J 105 class. Their next stop? Charleston, South Carolina's college big boat event. The Princeton Sailing Keelboat Team headed to Larchmont the first weekend of October 2023 to sail in the 2023 Intercollegiate Offshore Regatta (IOR), hosted by Storm Trysail Club and Larchmont Yacht Club. During the IOR, after Saturday's race overcoming torrential rain and unstable wind conditions, along with Sunday's consistent wind, the Tigers won the final two races– also excitingly resulting in an overall win in our class in the J 105 fleet!

I am very thankful to the entire team – Bracklinn Williams '25, Virginia Cobbs '25, Richard Kertatos '26, William Roberts '26, and Cole Crosby '26 – for all their hard work and the dedication they have put in, committing an entire day-trip to drive to Larchmont and back for an extra practice session the day before the IOR.

Thirty-three Princeton Sailors traveled to sunny Sarasota, Florida, during their final week of winter break (January 21st - 27th) to prepare for the upcoming spring regatta season. This year, we had eight new team members experiencing their first winter sailing training camp. It is always a pleasant experience to realize or remember that warmer weather and smoother sailing is only a short plane ride away!

The conditions could not have been more perfect, starting with a 15-18 knot south-westerly on Sunday and Monday that would gradually taper off throughout the week to finish with a soothing 6-knot seabreeze as we sailed the boats in at sunset, capping off a fantastic week.

Each year I have taken part in this trip, the experience has improved remarkably, on and off the water. As a coach, it is so rewarding to have many of our returning sailors start the week vocalizing how great it was to officially join the team and the sport of sailing, and seeing those same sailors teaching and helping our new members— shoes they were in exactly a year ago— through learning maneuvers, rigging, and rules. It speaks to how inclusive and driven our team culture is right now. It amazes people every time I say we are taking over thirty students down to Sarasota, Florida for a week of sailing with just one coach, and some might even say there is no way you will have an effective week of coaching with over thirty students to tend to. Those same people have yet to see how, in the past three years, our team has grown to care for each other, lend a hand, share their experiences, and give helpful advice.
